A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A TIME LIMIT FOR PUBLIC COMMENTS DURING COUNCIL MEETINGS AND THE MEANS OF EXTENDING

WHEREAS, there have been abuses of the time allotted members of the public to make comments on items not found on the agenda during various council meetings; and

WHEREAS, it would be in the best interest of the public and the City to put a time limit on the individuals addressing the Council on issues not found on the agenda during the meeting to insure that all concerned members of the public have an opportunity to address the council;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF RAWLINS, CARBON COUNTY, WYOMING that a time limit of five (5) minutes be placed upon each member of the public addressing the council during the portion of the council meetings designated as "Public Participation", provided, however, that, upon request from the member of the public or any council member, the council may extend the time period for those items requiring additional time for presentation and of sufficient interest of the council.
